The 1906 Award celebrates the foundation of the Geneva-based <u>International Electrotechnical Commission</u> in 1906. It is awarded each year to a small group of experts who have contributed in an outstanding manner to the global standardization work of the IEC.

To many in the electrical industry in Ireland, Jim Keogh's name has become synonymous with the work of the Wiring Rules committee. He has also carved out a highly respected reputation for Ireland on the international stage through his participation in IEC TC64, and at the European level in CENELEC TC64.

In making the award to Mr Keogh, the IEC spoke of his detailed knowledge of electrical installations and his many years of invaluable contribution to the development of IEC 60364.

At a recent presentation hosted by the NSAI at the Department of Jobs, Enterprise and Innovation, Jim Keogh was presented with his award by the Minister for Small Business, Mr John Perry, TD.
